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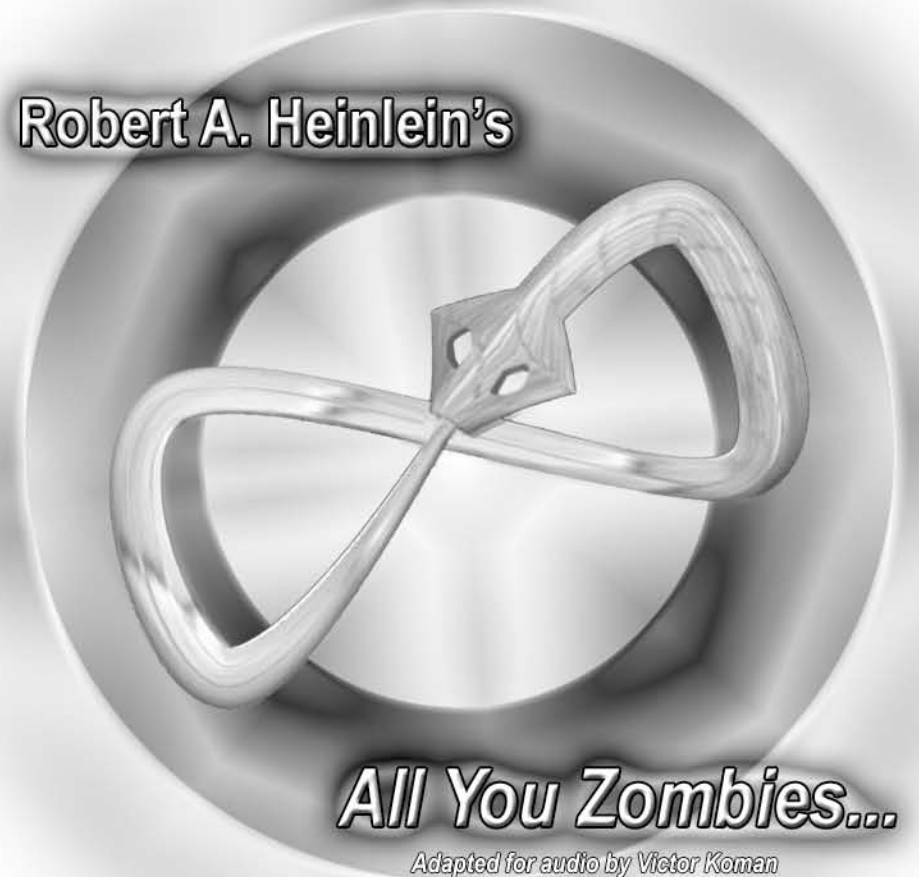

## **Breaking Radio Silence...**

During the production of this show I was asked a very simple question. What is *All You Zombies...* about? Turns out that's not such a simple question after all. First published in 1959 it has become one of the classic time travel/paradox stories, known to Science Fiction fans the world over. But is it, as the name implies, a work of horror?

Well, yes and no. Concentrating on the themes of time travel and paradox, the story might be dismissed as a mere mental exercise on the part of the author. But as the story progresses it leads the listener on that same mental exercise and sparks that most imaginative of questions... "What if...?" There are, unfortunately, no actual zombies.

But from its opening jokes about a man who walks into a bar to the haunting final line of the play, Victor Koman's adaptation brings forth all the potential of a story whose logical conclusions can be seen as horrifying indeed.

The speculations I make here are intentionally vague in order to allow the uninitiated to come to the revelation for themselves, but if, after the show is over, you are still confused by the events described, stop by our sales table and pick up a free copy of a chart that should make things clearer for you. Time travel stories can be confusing.

I would like to close by making special mention of Megan Jackson and Clair Kiernan, two of our very talented actresses who could not be with us tonight due to prior commitments, but who nevertheless helped me bring to life my vision for the symbolic icon that graces this cover, and eventually the cover for the upcoming studio production. The snake Ouroboros twisted into a Moebius strip. A Paradox become Infinity.

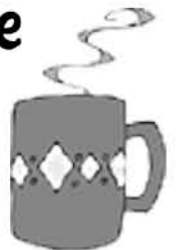
